<b>Course title</b>	<b>Tourism and Transport: State of the art and emerging issues</b>
<b>Hours per week (SWS)</b>	2
<b>Number of ECTS credits</b>	3
<b>Course objective</b>	To introduce students to the state of the art and emerging issues in tourism and transport. To provide students with a clearer understanding of legal and planning issues in transport and visitor management.
