Course content	During the internship, students will experience, practice and reflect on entrepreneurial thinking and responsible action in a start-up. The internship serves to develop a professional identity and an entrepreneurial mindset.
Learning outcomes	During their work with start-ups, certificate participants learn how to apply what they have learned so far in practical contexts. They are involved in independent projects, conceptual and/or research activities or research activities in innovative fields and/or change processes. These professional practice-oriented activities enable them to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • analyze and reflect on their professional practice in the fields of entrepreneurship, innovation processes and team dynamics; • test their own intervention activities and associated methodological knowledge and further develop them in practical demanding contexts; • translate their theoretical knowledge acquired during their studies into professional practice and to apply the methodological skills acquired during their studies in professional work situations; • experience and further develop their ability to work in an interdisciplinary and team-oriented manner - including intercultural work in the case of internships abroad - in complex professional fields;

- To gain an insight in order to confirm one's own ideas or to eliminate possible misconceptions.
- To apply and check one's own skills, interests and the knowledge already acquired during studies in practice.
- The internship company should be able to correctly assess the competences and specifically point out further development.

Requirements for the internship report

Formatting requirements

Please apply the basics of scientific work in your paper, including:

PDF format (File name: 2021_internship_report_yourname)

- Font size: 12, line spacing 1.5
- (If) Citation rule: APA
- Amount of text pages: 3 (+ Cover page)
- Header: Internship report - your name
- Footer: page number
- (If) Appendices: graphics, images, large tables, etc.
- Language: The internship report can be written in German or English.

Structure

- Cover sheet (TEMPLATE "COVER").
- (If) Table of contents, list of tables, list of figures, appendix.
- Introduction
- Main part (internship report)

Evaluation criteria of the internship report

- Formal criteria (format, structure, etc.)
- Content (comprehensibility, expressiveness, etc.)

The module is successfully completed when the internship report has been assessed with "successfully passed".
